Discussion Summary:

The meeting began with an Anti-Trust compliance statement reaffirming transparency and ethical collaboration. Updates were presented on organizational restructuring, including the completion of internal team expansion and induction of new staff in finance, HR, and IT.

The certification program progress was reviewed, noting version 3 transition status, onboarding of new audit agencies, compliance challenges, and decertification cases. Discussions also covered energy audits, regenerative agriculture, and potential carbon credit projects.

Anandita presented the MEL Study progress, covering survey plans, timelines, and third-party assurance. Communication updates included enhanced social media outreach, a consumer awareness survey, and webinar engagement.

Souvik provided a detailed overview of the IT governance and data security roadmap, ISO 27001 readiness, and future initiatives like AI integration and improved data protection.

Dr. Antara Bera presented on climate change adaptation within version 3, highlighting regenerative practices and energy efficiency measures. The meeting also discussed ongoing challenges in chemical residue management and the need for stronger enforcement and farmer education.
